Coalition of West Credit River proposes alternative option for Erin wastewater treatment plant

Town of Erin said it will implement specific mitigation strategies if there are issues with the water temperature

It recommends an in-ground indirect infiltration of the final effluent through an extensive underground perforated pipe system.

"It follows the same principles as a residential septic tile bed, but on a larger scale," explained Judy Mabee, chair of the Coalition for West Credit River and president of the Belfountain Community Organization. "The slow percolation of the infiltrated effluent through the large gravel deposit in this area is ideal for providing additional treatment, as well as to cool and dilute the effluent as it slowly infiltrates down through the natural sand and gravel filter. It then flows with the local groundwater to mix with the cold-water springs feeding the West Credit River."

The coalition says this is the best way to ensure the final effluent reaches the stream as natural and cold groundwater. This will allow the effluent to be cooled to average background groundwater temperatures of 9 C.

It could then emerge from the ground and enter a small tributary to the West Credit on the north side of the proposed land for new housing.

According to the Town of Erin, the practice has been looked at, but it has not deemed it necessary to adopt at this time.

"Infiltration beds were reviewed as an option during the environmental assessment and not included in the preferred options," said Nick Colucci, director of infrastructure services.

The town has said it will implement specific mitigation strategies if there are issues with the water temperature, though it believes this won't be a problem.

"The environmental assessment concluded that there would be no temperature impacts caused by the effluent entering the river," said Colucci. "The current proposal includes temperature monitoring of the effluent. The engineering design included mitigation measures to reduce temperature, including buried tanks, processes inside buildings, building locations to provide shading, including landscaped areas in the design."

This comes after Jonathan Wilkinson, federal minister of environment and climate change, decided not to designate the project under the federal impact assessment

had 90 days to decide what to do with the facility.

The coalition believes the town and its consultants, Ainley Group and WSP, along with the Ministry of Environment, Conservation and Parks (MECP) and the Credit Valley Conservation (CVC), proposed no unique or innovative measures to ensure the sewage effluent cool. In the case of this project, it says these organizations must establish unique and innovative standards to protect these sensitive native brook trout and redside dace populations and their cold-water West Credit River habitat.

"The only way for the town to show it has an effective and practical solution for heat removal would be to provide a technical memorandum with thermodynamic calculations," said Mabee. "This includes drawings showing the amount of heat energy transfer required to cool the effluent from 23 degrees Celsius to even 19 degrees Celsius for the substantial daily flow of 7,120,000 litres of warm effluent. To date, the town of Erin has not provided such detailed information."

Effluent infiltration systems have been used elsewhere in the province. For instance, the former Village of Markdale uses indirect infiltration of effluent to protect the Rocky Saugeen River, a sensitive, cold water brook trout habitat. Infiltration of effluent also occurs in Lucknow, located at the headwaters of the Nine Mile River, north of Goderich.


